

#### The Institution

The Wardens, standing before the Bishop with the new minister, say these or similar words,

Bishop Scott Barker, we have come together today to welcome Vanessa E. B. Clark, who has been chosen to serve as Dean of Trinity Episcopal Cathedral and our diocese. We believe that she is well qualified, and that she has been prayerfully and lawfully selected.

The Bishop reads the Letter of Institution.

Bishop Vanessa, do you, in the presence of this congregation and diocese, commit yourself to this new trust and

responsibility?

Dean I do.

The Bishop then addresses the congregation,

Bishop Will you who witness this new beginning support and uphold Vanessa in this ministry?

People We will.

*The Bishop presents a vessel of water, saying,* 

Vanessa, take this water, and help me baptize in obedience to our Lord.

People Amen

Junior Warden and Sexton present the keys of the church, saying,

Vanessa, receive these keys, and let the doors of this place be open to all people.



Bishop Let us then offer our prayers to God for all God's people, for this congregation, and for Vanessa our Dean.





The representative of diocese clergy presents the Constitution and Canons of this Church, saying, Vanessa, obey these Canons, and be among us to share in the councils of this diocese.

The Dean of St. Mark's Pro-Cathedral presents the seal of Trinity Cathedral, saying, Vanessa, accept this seal, and serve our diocese as Dean to the Church of the Bishop of Nebraska.

#### Collect of the Day

Amen.

#### The Word of God

First Reading Isaiah 7:10-14

Reader A reading from the Book of Isaiah.

Again the Lord spoke to Ahaz, saying, Ask a sign of the Lord your God; let it be deep as Sheol or high as heaven. But Ahaz said, I will not ask, and I will not put the Lord to the test. Then Isaiah said: "Hear then, O house of David! Is it too little for you to weary mortals, that you weary my God also? Therefore the Lord himself will give you a sign. Look, the young woman is with child and shall bear a son, and shall name him Immanuel."

Reader The Word of the Lord. People Thanks be to God.

**Psalm 40:5-10** BCP 640

Great things are they that you have done, O LORD my God!

how great your wonders and your plans for us!\*

there is none who can be compared with you.

Oh, that I could make them known and tell them!\*

but they are more than I can count.

In sacrifice and offering you take no pleasure \*

(you have given me ears to hear you);

Burnt-offering and sin-offering you have not required, \*

and so I said, "Behold, I come.

In the roll of the book it is written concerning me: \*

'I love to do your will, O my God; your law is deep in my heart."

I proclaimed righteousness in the great congregation; \*

behold, I did not restrain my lips; and that, O LORD, you know.

Second Reading

Hebrews 10:4-10

*Reader* A reading from the Letter to the Hebrews.

It is impossible for the blood of bulls and goats to take away sins. Consequently, when Christ came into the world, he said,

"Sacrifices and offerings you have not desired, but a body you have prepared for me;

in burnt offerings and sin offerings you have taken no pleasure.

Then I said, 'See, God, I have come to do your will, O God' (in the scroll of the book it is written of me)."

When he said above, "You have neither desired nor taken pleasure in sacrifices and offerings and burnt offerings and sin offerings" (these are offered according to the law), then he added, "See, I have come to do your will." He abolishes the first in order to establish the second. And it is by God's will that we have been sanctified through the offering of the body of Jesus Christ once for all.



Holy Gospel Luke 1:26-38

Deacon People The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke. Glory to you, Lord Christ

In the sixth month the angel Gabriel was sent by God to a town in Galilee called Nazareth, to a virgin engaged to a man whose name was Joseph, of the house of David. The virgin's name was Mary. And he came to her and said, "Greetings, favored one! The Lord is with you." But she was much perplexed by his words and pondered what sort of greeting this might be. The angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God. And now, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you will name him Jesus. He will be great, and will be called the Son of the Most High, and the Lord God will give to him the throne of his ancestor David. He will reign over the house of Jacob forever, and of his kingdom there will be no end." Mary said to the angel, "How can this be, since I am a virgin?" The angel said to her, "The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you; therefore the child to be born will be holy; he will be called Son of God. And now, your relative Elizabeth in her old age has also conceived a son; and this is the sixth month for her who was said to be barren. For nothing will be impossible with God." Then Mary said, "Here am I, the servant of the Lord; let it be with me according to your word." Then the angel departed from her.

#### The Induction

Representatives of the congregation and of the clergy of the diocese stand before the Bishop with the new minister.

Youth and Sunday School present a dean's vestment, saying,

Vanessa, receive these garments, and be among us as a pastor and priest.

People Amen

Altar Guild presents a priest communion kit, saying,

Vanessa use these vessels, and be among us as a healer and reconciler.

People Amen

The Bishop then says

Vanessa, let all these be signs of the ministry which is mine and yours in this place.

People Amen

The new Minister, if a priest, may then kneel in the midst of the church, and say,

O Lord my God, I am not worthy to have you come under my roof; yet you have called your servant to stand in your house, and to serve at your altar. To you and to your service I devote myself, body, soul, and spirit. Fill my memory with the record of your mighty works; enlighten my understanding with the light of your Holy Spirit; and may all the desires of my heart and will center in what you would have me do. Make me an instrument of your salvation for the people entrusted to my care, and grant that I may faithfully administer your holy Sacraments, and by my life and teaching set forth your true and living Word. Be always with me in carrying out the duties of my ministry. In prayer, quicken my devotion; in praises, heighten my love and gratitude; in preaching, give me readiness of thought and expression; and grant that, by the clearness and brightness of your holy Word, all the world may be drawn into your blessed kingdom. All this I ask for the sake of your Son our Savior Jesus Christ. **Amen**.

The Bishop then presents the new minister to the congregation, saying, Greet your new Dean, The Very Rev. Vanessa Elaine Black Clark.

The new Dean then says to the people, The peace of the Lord be always with you.

The Ministers and People greet one another in a sign of Christ's Peace.

People


